JGood morning,

I am following up after my previous email inquiry (Sunday, June 30).

During hurricane season, residents of the flood zone carefully watch weather patterns knowing we could experience a significant flood again, with any storm or heavy rain. It is a very stressful experience and not knowing if we can expect support from the Municipality/ Public Work should we experience flooding, adds to our stress.

Over the last three years, CSOs, flooding etc have been a regular and ongoing topic at both Council and COTW meetings yet, to our knowledge there is no actionable plan in place, specifically to support us in the event of another flood.

Residents often contact those of us on (south) Stannus Street asking about the pump, as it was purchased in response to the 2021 flood and it was communicated that it would be on the waterfront as a support during weather events. These questions prompted my previous email.

Any information on the pump and its usability during heavy rainfall, flood advisories etc, would be very helpful and much appreciated.

As you may know, Hants County was included in a flood advisor issued for Saturday evening, June 29 into Sunday morning, June 30.

Residents of the flood zone were concerned to find that the pump was not onsite on the waterfront ahead of this weather system.

We, as residents who have experienced the effects of flash flooding, diligently watch these weather advisories. Especially at this time of year after two major July floods in recent years.

The pump was supposed to be an emergency measure for the flood zone and when it is not in place it adds to the stress experienced by residents.

Do you know why the pump was not in place? Should we not expect to see it on the waterfront during weather advisories and flood warnings? It would be helpful for us to know.
